Unemployment in Edinburgh currently stands at 2.4% and has been consistently and significantly below the Scottish and UK average for several years. Investment in the future of the city represents some £6bn of developments at locations including the city centre, Edinburgh's Waterfront, Edinburgh Science Triangle and West Edinburgh. It is hoped such projects will bring an additional 60,000 jobs to the region.

The Glasgow-Edinburgh Collaboration

Since 1995, half of Scotland's extra jobs have been created in Glasgow and Edinburgh, so it is not surprising that the two cities are now combining resources to make an even bigger impact not only on the Scottish economy and business community, but also on the international stage.

Already out-performing most UK rivals, together the two cities have the potential to move themselves and Scotland up the European rankings.
