Biddenden Vineyards is Kent's oldest family owned vineyard and the county's largest producer of traditional ciders. Ten varieties of grapes produce White, Red, Rose and Quality Sparkling Wine and traditional Kentish Ciders have also been made here for over 20 years together with farm pressed apple juices. Situated close to the Channel ports, the Vineyards also make an ideal stopping point when travelling to or from the continent. Visitors are welcome throughout the year.
