 Liverpool ONE – This £1bn development in the city centre by Grosvenor Estates has created more than 1.6 million sq ft of retail, 30 new buildings, hotels, apartments, a cinema and a new park. It has seen Liverpool catapulted from 17th to fifth place in the league tables of shopping popularity.
