To 2024 and beyond

The SCS entitled: 'Liverpool: a thriving international city - 2024' is a working document that tells a story of the city and sets out Liverpool's plans for the future in five areas:

- Competitiveness
- Connectivity
- Distinctive Sense of Place
- Thriving Neighbourhoods
- Health and Wellbeing.

All Liverpool First partners have contributed and signed up to the long-term vision set out in the city vision, which highlights key areas for change and outcomes that organisations are aiming to achieve through partnership working. Carol Perry, Director for Liverpool First, said: "We've come a long way since the partnership was set up seven years ago. Our membership has increased and people now come to the partnership with a real ambition to deliver effective cross-organisational working and commitment in achieving the city vision."
