The venues

Manchester's diverse venues include a 19,000-seat arena, a convention complex in the heart of the city and an unrivalled range of additional meeting rooms available at other facilities within the region. There are also some 19,000 bedrooms across Greater Manchester from budget to five star and 17,000 car parking spaces.

Manchester offers associations a wide range of meeting options. From modern, purpose-built meeting facilities to the elegant splendour of re-furbished Victorian buildings, whatever the subject matter and whoever the audience, visitors can be assured that Manchester will provide the ideal back-drop for their event.

Manchester Central, in the heart of the city, provides auditorium seating for 800, 12 break-out rooms of various sizes and approximately 1,900 sq m of exhibition space in its multi-purpose hall. Additionally there is a column-free hall of 10,350 sq m, providing a flexible and easily divisible exhibition space or a tiered auditorium for over 4,000.

Manchester Evening News Arena is Europe's busiest indoor concert venue, built alongside Victoria Station. The venue can be transformed from an intimate theatre environment for 3,000 to a state-of-the-art arena capable of accommodating 19,000. By contrast, Manchester's international concert venue, **The Bridgewater Hall**, with its breathtaking and awardwinning architecture, provides auditorium seating for 1,875 as well as spacious waterside foyers and function spaces looking out over the canal basin.

Excellent **academic venues** are available across the city region, combining purpose built conference facilities with historic charm. A number of magnificent **country retreats** are within easy reach of the city centre, offering a winning combination of excellent conference amenities and exclusive locations.

There are over 7,000 city centre rooms. Over 450 are within five star accommodation, not forgetting a wide range of budget accommodation options.

Explore the city

To enable business visitors to get the most out of their time in Manchester, there is a wide range of pre- and post-conference tour options available to fill an hour or a full weekend. Discover the Pre-Raphaelite collections at Manchester Art Gallery, the contemporary exhibitions at Urbis – the museum devoted to city life, and the Museum of Science and Industry on the site of the world's oldest passenger railway station. Alternatively, visit a theme park or experience a sporting fixture at one of the region's well-revered sports clubs – the choice is truly inspirational. As the fashion capital of the north, shoppers are drawn to Harvey Nichols, Selfridges, numerous designer stores, as well as the shopping mecca that is the Trafford Centre.

Beyond the city centre
