hether this is your first visit or you are a returning friend, I am sure you will be able to see immediately the ongoing physical transformation which has taken place in the city over recent years.

Through strong vision and continuing investment the city has witnessed a major economic and cultural renaissance over the past two decades. This investment has seen significant improvements in the city's housing stock and the development of truly world-class office facilities.
