Located between Liverpool and Manchester, the borough of Halton straddles the River Mersey encompassing the towns of Runcorn and Widnes and the parishes of Hale, Daresbury, Moore, Preston Brook, Halebank and Sandymoor. A vibrant, progressive borough with first rate transport links, Halton has, and continues, to invest in regenerating its town centres and to support and encourage diverse business and employment prospects.

Halton Borough Council is a dynamic and achieving unitary authority that is creating real opportunities for all. Our aim is to continue to deliver excellent services that help ensure our communities enjoy a good quality of life and achieve their full potential.

A brief history of Halton

Links between the two towns of Widnes and Runcorn stretch back 900 years to the early 12th century when land on both sides of the river formed part of the Halton Barony.

Citizens from the Widnes area had to pay taxes at Halton Castle in Runcorn and a ferry service soon linked the two settlements.



Around the mid-19th century, the British chemical industry began in Widnes utilising Lancashire coal and Cheshire salt. Factories developed on both sides of the river and trade, labour and skills quickly became interlinked. As a result of this, in 1868 the London to Liverpool railway opened, followed in 1905 by a transporter bridge to carry road traffic and pedestrians. These constructions reinforced the links between the two towns which were increased even further when the borough's major landmark, the Silver Jubilee Bridge, opened in 1961. The bridge is listed for its architectural importance and is reminiscent of the Sydney Harbour Bridge!

Halton today

Although chemical manufacturing in Widnes and Runcorn remains an important part of the economy, it has now diversified into a broad range of other manufacturing and service industries, which are all benefiting the area.

The Council has increasingly concentrated its efforts towards regenerating Halton in order to make it a viable and attractive place in which to live, work and invest. Significant advances have been made in terms of attracting new business, housing, leisure and shopping opportunities.

Over the past decade more than 200 acres of contaminated land has been reclaimed. Green space now covers 18% of the borough, including picturesque nature reserves at Pickering's Pasture and Spike Island, along the banks of the Mersey, which today is an area of grassland and woodland providing a fascinating history trail.

Retail and leisure is thriving with the new Widnes Retail Park, The Hive on Widnes Waterfront - a development made up of a cinema, ice rink, bowling alley, restaurants, hotel and public house - and a major refurbishment at Runcorn Shopping Centre.

Sport is also a major part of people's lives in the area, with Select Security Stadium, Halton, being the home to Rugby Super League team, Widnes Vikings. This unique community stadium, owned and managed by Halton Borough Council, is also a popular wedding and conference venue as well as offering a health and fitness suite, social club and other sporting facilities.

Elsewhere, The Brindley has proved to be a popular arts and cultural asset for the area, attracting many big names in theatre, music and comedy, as well as





providing a unique exhibition area, cinema and space for community and education projects.

Looking to the future, Halton, with its partners, continues the transformation of the borough, with developments such as Mersey Multimodal Gateway (3MG) which is destined to be one of the UK's largest inter-modal logistics parks and attracting high profile tenants due to its unrivalled access to the UK's deep sea ports and excellent proximity to the region's motorway network.

One of the UK's leading science and innovation campuses, Sci-Tech Daresbury, is based in Halton. This is a good example of the success of a private-public joint-venture partnership, in this case between the developer Langtree Property Partners, the Science and Technology Facilities Council (STFC) and Halton Borough Council. The enterprise zone has entered its next phase of development with the start of work on two new buildings which will deliver up to 350 new jobs. And finally, an integral feature of Halton's transformation is the Mersey Gateway Project; this is a major scheme to build a new six-lane toll bridge over the River Mersey. It will link the towns of Runcorn and Widnes and will relieve the congested and ageing Silver Jubilee Bridge. Throughout the lifetime of the Project, an estimated 4,640 new jobs will be created through direct employment, regeneration activity and inward investment.

Connectivity

Runcorn & Widnes' superb transport links make the area easily accessible by road, rail, air and sea.

Their location between Manchester International Airport and Liverpool John Lennon Airport, one of Europe's fastest growing regional airports, plus their proximity to the continually developing Port of Liverpool, means that national and global markets are within easy reach.

With 60 per cent of UK industry and over 23 million consumers within two hours' drive time of Halton, local companies have access to hundreds of thousands of potential customers and employees.

Transport within the Borough is made easy by the modern network of roads and expressways. Halton has a unique system of 17km of dedicated Busway serving the major employment and residential areas. Located within the M56 & M62 corridors, Halton is ideally situated at the heart of the region's motorway network.

Two railway stations, Runcorn Mainline & Runcorn East, provide fast and frequent services throughout the UK. Commuters can be in Liverpool in 20 minutes and London in less than 2 hours. There are also regular connections to Birmingham, Chester, Crewe, Manchester and North Wales.

The construction of The Mersey Gateway, a major scheme to build a new six lane toll bridge over the Mersey, is estimated to be complete by 2017. This landmark structure, named as one of the world's most important infrastructure projects, will bring about much needed traffic relief for the existing Silver Jubilee Bridge. It will also provide a major strategic new transport route linking the Liverpool City Region, north Cheshire and the North West to the rest of the country.

Mersey Gateway

Construction work has now started on the new Mersey Gateway Bridge which will provide a crucial new road link between Runcorn and Widnes.

The Merseylink team started work in April 2014 and the new bridge should be open to traffic by autumn 2017. Both the new Mersey Gateway Bridge and the existing Silver Jubilee Bridge will be tolled once the new bridge opens, but they will be free for Halton residents to cross.

Residents of Halton will still need to register to use the bridges and there will be a small charge for this.

The Mersey Gateway Project is a major scheme to build a new six-lane toll bridge over the Mersey between the towns of Runcorn and Widnes that will relieve the congested and ageing Silver Jubilee Bridge.

The project also includes or facilitates:

- plans to develop and integrate public transport, cycle and pedestrian links across Halton
- plans to kick start a major 20-year regeneration programme for Halton
- improving regional transport links to encourage new and inward investment

The new bridge will:

- be predominately funded by the private sector
- mean an estimated 4,640 new jobs through direct employment, regeneration activity and inward investment
- generate an estimated £61.9 million a year in Gross Value Added from the new jobs by 2030
- cross the river around 1.5km to the east of the Silver Jubilee Bridge
- increase journey time reliability
- have three lanes across the Mersey in each direction with a speed limit of 60mph



 form the centerpiece of a new and improved high standard link road (9.5km long) connecting the national motorway network in north Cheshire with Merseyside.

A landmark design

The Mersey Gateway Bridge will be a landmark structure that will be recognisable throughout the North West and beyond. The bridge design is based on a cable-stay structure similar to the second Severn Crossing but with three towers. It will be 2.3km long with a river span of 1km.

Three pylons will cross the naturally occurring deeper water channels of the river at either bank. These will be supported by cable stays attached to towers that rise to between 80 and 125 m above the river bed.

There are two Mersey Gateway Visitor Centres - one in the Catalyst Science Discovery Centre in Widnes and one in Runcorn Shopping Centre. Both are staffed by Mersey Gateway volunteers who are on hand to answer questions on everything from local history and heritage, environment and ecology, to the bridge construction. The Catalyst Centre also hosts trips to the rooftop observatory where visitors can get a bird's eye view of the work that is taking place in the estuary.



There is also a special Mersey Gateway Environmental Trial on Wigg Island in Runcorn where visitors can get a feel for how the bridge is interacting with the environment and learn more about the amazing wildlife and plants on Wigg Island and in the Upper Mersey Estuary.

Economic benefits

Year one figures show a direct contribution from the Mersey Gateway Project to the North West regional economy since work began of some £44million. The figures account for work placed by the main Merseylink Civil Contractors Joint Venture with 138 different suppliers and sub-contractors based within a 30-mile radius of the site in Halton during the first year of work on the project.

At the peak of activity it is estimated up to 1,000 people will be working on the project across Halton, adding further to the local economy.

Halton - a place to do business

With one the UK's most significant infrastructure projects underway, a world-class centre for 'big scale' science open for business, and an enviable reputation for getting things done, it's no wonder Halton is getting everyone talking.

Halton Borough Council may be one of the UK's smallest local authorities, but its ambition, determination, and a 'can-do' attitude, plus its ability to form effective partnerships, is delivering significant results.

Over £250m has been invested in the borough in the last ten years. Retail and leisure is thriving with the new Widnes Retail Park, The Hive Leisure Park on Widnes Waterfront and an on-going programme of large-scale improvements at Runcorn Shopping Centre. Over 3,200 businesses now call Halton home, including big names such as the Stobart Group, Diageo, ABB, Mexichem and Inovyn. Halton has gained prominence as a place of science and enterprise. Daresbury Innovation Centre and The Heath Business and Technical Park provide the base for world-class science companies and high-tech research and development facilities. Sci-Tech Daresbury, one of the two UK centres for 'big-scale' science, has been an enterprise zone since August 2011 and is home to over 100 technology companies.

Halton's geographical position makes it perfectly located to be a logistics hub and the thriving 200 hectare Mersey Multimodal Gateway (3MG) in Widnes is an ideal warehousing and distribution facility. In fact, all Halton businesses benefit from the area's excellent road, rail, and air links.

The Council is committed to improving the health and economic wellbeing of its community and is working hard to improve the skills and education attainment in the borough as well as the



aspirations of its residents. Initiatives like Halton Employment Partnership (HEP) are ensuring local people are well placed to benefit from the new opportunities on offer. Its work with employers such as Merseylink and Tarmac has already resulted in apprenticeship opportunities and job outcomes for local people in a wide range of job roles.

In June 2013, the Merseylink consortium was appointed as the preferred bidder for the Mersey Gateway Project and construction commenced in 2014. The new six-lane toll bridge over the Mersey will be the catalyst for the regeneration of some 20 km² of the borough on either side of the river, generating nearly 5,000 new jobs.

Acres of affordable space for growing businesses plus a skilled, productive, adaptable and committed workforce, which is fully supported by customised education and training facilities, makes Halton a place where business succeeds.

- Nearly **60,000** people work in Halton

Business support in Halton

Business Improvement and Growth Team

Halton Borough Council's Business Improvement and Growth Team (BIG) is the interface between the Council and the business community with regard to a broad range of business support services.

The team offers a bespoke service which is tailored to the requirements of each company and can provide advice and guidance on subjects as diverse as the availability of grant funding, development and planning issues, transportation matters and recruitment. The team acts as a single point of contact, helping companies to access the help and assistance provided by other Council departments and a range of external agencies. It is also responsible for managing Halton's funding programmes from Government and Europe relating to business support and works closely with companies throughout the life-cycle of their claim.

The BIG Team provides a free commercial property finding service for those companies either based in Halton or wishing to move into the area. It maintains a database which details all the industrial, retail and office property, as well as development land available to buy or rent within Runcorn and Widnes which is currently being marketed by a range of commercial property agents.

During the last eighteen months, the team managed more than four hundred investment enquiries from companies either already based in the Borough who were seeking to expand or other companies wishing to relocate to Halton. There is a continuing upward trend of interest with the number of enquiries and conversions in 2014/15 surpassing the pre-recession figures for 2008 including an increase in demand for development sites.

Local Growth Hub

Liverpool City Region Local Enterprise Partnership (LCR LEP) is working with its local public and private sector partners, including Local Authorities, Chambers of Commerce and other business support organisations to deliver a comprehensive business brokerage service that actively assists companies in the City Region to find the business advice they need.

In September 2015, the Halton Growth Hub Partnership, made up of Halton Borough Council and Halton Chamber of Commerce and Enterprise, was awarded the contract to deliver the Local Growth Hub in Halton which will be active from January 2016. The aim of the Hubs is to provide a holistic approach to business support and to function as a 'one-stop shop', acting as a signposting service and as the central repository of information, advice and support within a defined local area.

Local Growth Hubs are not a physical entity, however, a core team of Business Brokers will be based at the LEP and a single Business Broker will be based in each Local Authority area to deliver face to advice to businesses, tailored to local needs and to help align local support with national programmes. The Local Growth Hub will not primarily be a direct supplier of services to businesses. Instead it will have a crucial interface role between the business community, strategic partners and commercial providers.

Halton Employment Partnership

Halton Employment Partnership (HEP) is a strategic level Partnership which brings together expertise from various employment, learning and skills development agencies in Halton and can support inward investors and local businesses with a 'complete employment offer'.

Support can range from a free commercial property finding service to recruitment, training and tailored support with large and small scale recruitment projects. It also has a brief to ensure that inward investors and local businesses have a readily available and skilled workforce within the locality.

HEP includes Halton Borough Council (Economy, Enterprise & Property / Employment, Learning & Skills), Job Centre Plus, Riverside College, Halton Chamber of Commerce, Local Housing Trust, private and voluntary sector training providers, National Apprenticeship Service and Skills Funding Agency. One example of the effectiveness of the Partnership is the support given to both Tarmac Lafarge and Merseylink who wanted to recruit local residents. HEP delivered a course in Traffic Management & Highway Maintenance for Tarmac Lafarge and as a result, attendees were offered highway maintenance apprenticeships and roles in traffic management.

Merseylink and HEP worked together to develop a 6 week pre-employment construction programme whereby candidates spent time improving their workplace skills and learning vital lessons geared at preparing them for work on a construction project. This involved a week's work experience on the Merseylink site before the final interviews which led to a number of successful full-time appointments on the project.

Business Start-ups

Halton residents, and those wishing to start up their own business in Halton, can access free business start-up advice and funding from external agencies such as The Prince's Trust and People Plus.

The Prince's Trust offers support for unemployed people up to the age of 30.

It can provide help with producing a business plan, training and access to funding plus the benefit of advice from an experienced business mentor.

People Plus delivers various courses depending on an individual's eligibility and whether the referral is via the Government's Work Programme or through the New Enterprise Allowance Scheme (NEA). Its Business Start-up Programme has three levels which can be tailored to specific needs depending on existing business experience; Intensive (13 weeks), Intermediate (eight weeks) and Basic (six weeks). NEA provides mentoring support and financial assistance in the form of a weekly allowance for a total of 26 weeks and an eight week business training scheme.

Funding

Over the last few years, Halton companies have been able to benefit from funding from two highly successful programmes supported by Halton Borough Council.

The European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) 4.2 Merseyside Business Support Programme provided detailed and tailored support so that SMEs could understand their wider business needs in order to grow. A minimum of two days specialist support was provided by an expert in the required field which included areas such as improving HR practices and procedures, international marketing and exporting, and manufacturing and process efficiency. Nearly £300,000 was provided 'in kind' to the 114 businesses that engaged with the programme and as a direct result, 60 jobs were created and 16 jobs safeguarded.

Regional Growth Funds 3 & 4 (RGF)

were designed to help companies secure investment in their business and improve their competitiveness resulting in business growth and jobs being created or safeguarded. Capital expenditure for equipment and buildings plus requirements for software and training were some of the eligible categories. Over £680,000 was distributed in grant to 11 companies and 25 jobs were created, with 23 safeguarded. Halton businesses benefited significantly more from this fund than other area in the Liverpool City Region.



These two specific programmes have now closed but Halton is expecting more funding to be released during 2016. (More information is available from Tim Leather, HBC Business Improvement & Growth Team; see contact details in first section). However, there are currently two RGF programmes which Halton businesses are able to access - the Merseyside Jobs and Growth Fund and the Merseyside Special Investment Fund (MSIF).

Launched in February 2015, the **Merseyside** Jobs and Growth Fund is managed by St Helens Chamber and provides grants for existing SME businesses planning to expand or invest in Liverpool City Region, which includes Halton, creating new jobs for local people. Grants of up to £75,000 are available to provide investment for growth when suitable finance is not available elsewhere. Grants are available for a range of projects with a minimum project value of £30,000 that will create new employment opportunities, such as purchasing new premises, expanding current premises or capital expenditure on plant and machinery.

Complementing the above, the MSIF is now accepting expressions of interest from SMEs for its new High Growth Business Investment Programme funded by the Regional Growth Fund Round 6 Programme. MSIF bid for a £5m share of the RGF pot to allow it to invest between $\pounds75k$ and £200,000 by way of grants and between £200,000 and £1 million available as a repayable loan. This finance can be used to support businesses wanting to grow or relocate in the Liverpool City Region and generate or preserve jobs in the area. The grant provided through this fund can total up to 20% of the overall project cost with the remainder coming from other sources of finance or applicants' own funds.



This can include capital to fund new premises and to extend or upgrade existing ones as well as investment for new equipment. Additional related expenditure on training, research and development, and employing disabled or disadvantaged workers can also be included.

Within Halton there are 16 major industrial areas and three principal retail areas, of which the main ones are listed here.

Astmoor Industrial Estate

Astmoor Industrial Estate is a large modern estate totaling 2.3 million square feet of primarily industrial space. The estate covers an area of approximately 195 acres and has 120 businesses mainly from the engineering, industrial and manufacturing sectors employing 3,200 people.

Sci-Tech Daresbury

Daresbury Science and Innovation Campus (DSIC) is an international hub for world class science and comprises a mix of high quality office, laboratory and technical space. The campus and enterprise zone were re-branded as Sci-Tech Daresbury in July 2012. The campus is currently home to over 100 technology businesses as well as the Science and Technology Facilities Council. Over 1,200 people work in a variety of companies from start-ups to more mature SMEs and international corporates.

The latest developments, Techspace One and Techspace Two, will together provide 56,000 sq. ft. of Grade A office and laboratory space which is expected to attract companies from sectors such as biomedical, material science, advanced engineering and clean technology. One will be home to 16 separate laboratory units of between 900 sq ft and 2,000 sq ft. Construction work is expected to be completed by summer 2016.



Support packages to assist with internal fit-out are available for both the new laboratories and the office space. As an Enterprise Zone, tenants will be eligible to benefit from five years' relief on local authority business rates. www.sci-techdaresbury.com



3MG

Predicted to be one of UK's largest intermodal logistics parks, 3MG - Mersey Multimodal Gateway in Widnes - is a public/private partnership with daily rail links that offer unrivalled access to the UK's key deep sea ports. The park covers 200 hectares and handles in excess of 190.000 containers each year - of which 100,000 are moved by rail; this saves 25 million miles by road per year. There are currently 530,000 sq. ft. of existing distribution sheds on site, with outline consent for a total of 2.7m sq. ft. of new build, rising eventually to 3.5m sq. ft. of space. www.3-mg.co.uk

Halebank Industrial Estate

Halebank Industrial Estate is a small light industrial estate located on the western side of Widnes with easy access to the A562 Speke Road, the Silver Jubilee Bridge, 3MG and local airports. It houses nearly forty businesses which employ over 1,000 people, covering a wide range of services and manufactured goods. Halebank is also a Business Improvement District (BID). Widnes Waterfront

The Widnes Waterfront is a multi-million pound regeneration programme driving the transformation of over 360 acres of former industrial land on the banks of the River Mersey. The programme benefited from £6.2m European Regional Development Funding, £5.1m from the Northwest Development Agency and approximately £3.5m of Halton Strategic Partnership and Halton Borough Council funds.

The revitalised Widnes Waterfront is now a commercial and tourism development site where high quality office accommodation sits alongside a successful leisure park in a stunning riverside setting.

Runcorn Town Centre

Runcorn Town Centre is full of history and heritage with many independent shops, the award winning Brindley Arts Centre and three integral waterways. The traditional high street shopping atmosphere is complemented by a weekly street market and has the added bonus of plenty of free car parking.

The Council has established Runcorn Town Team, charged with spending the £100,000 High Street Innovation Fund on initiatives to increase footfall in the town. Initiatives to date include the Commercial Property Renewal Grant (now fully subscribed), a Business Start-up Grant, improved signage and more large scale community activities. All have had a positive result, with the grants encouraging new businesses to open and enabling existing ones to update their premises. **www.runcorntownteam.co.uk**

Runcorn Shopping Centre

The enclosed centre is 550,000 sq. ft. in size and hosts recognizable brands from the high street such as Boots, Argos, Dorothy Perkins and New Look



plus many independent retailers. There is also the opportunity for local, small businesses to take space in the market style environment of The Box, without tying into a long lease.

The large central town square is an ideal community space and hosts exhibitions and events. Use of public transport is encouraged as the Centre contains two of Runcorn's main bus stations and this is complemented by extensive free car parking for 2,200 vehicles.

2013 saw a major rebranding and £4m was spent on refurbishment including enhancing the car parks and landscaping the approach. Plans are on-going for the redevelopment of 25,000sq ft. interior space to transform the Centre into a shopping venue that has everything for the local community.

Widnes Town Centre

Widnes has a diverse and expanding shopping offer. Green Oaks Shopping Centre is anchored by an 82,000 sq. ft. WM Morrison Supermarket, set around an undercover mall populated with well known & independent retailers. It is adjacent to the long-established Widnes Market, which has both a market hall and an open market; the latter was awarded the title of 'Best small outdoor market 2014' by the National Association of British Market Authorities. ASTMOOR & HALEBANK BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (BID)

What is a BID?

A Business Improvement District (BID) is a partnership between businesses and property owners including Halton Chamber of Commerce & Enterprise.

The vision of the partnership is:

"To promote Astmoor BID & Halebank BID as a location of choice for both employers and employees across Cheshire and Merseyside, by working in partnership to focus on our four themes for improvement"

The BID is implementing a range of projects focusing on: increasing business security and preventing crime; image enhancement measures across the estate and; providing a range of support functions that will benefit all businesses.

In December 2007, businesses and property owners on the estate approved the proposal to create a BID between April 1st 2008 and March 31st 2013. The BID was further endorsed by businesses when they voted in favour of a renewal BID, for a further 5 years, in March 2013.

How is it managed?

The BID is managed by businesses and property owners on the estate through an elected Executive Committee.

The BID manager is responsible for implementing the business plan and ensuring that the BID Levy collected by the Council is spent in line with the BID Business Plan.

Connecting Cheshire



As part of the Connecting Cheshire Partnership, Halton along with Warrington, Cheshire East, Chester West and Chester Councils, is working with BT to deliver Superfast fibre broadband to areas hitherto outside the commercial deployment of fibre broadband.

By the end of 2015, over 90,000 additional premises across Cheshire will be able to upgrade to fibre broadband. This is great news for anyone running a business or with multiple devices all requiring internet access. You can work or play - smarter, faster, better - whether from your smartphone, TV, tablet or computer.

Superfast broadband is not just about a faster internet experience or about doing one thing quicker. You can work smarter, faster, better, with multiple users online at the same time with no slowdown. Superfast broadband will help you improve productivity and use your resources more effectively. For example, you might want to to make your marketing digital and enhance your customer communications with social media by using faster and easier to track options like Facebook and Twitter.

An additional 10,000 premises are also expected to be reached by summer 2017, bringing the total fibre coverage across Cheshire to around 98%.

The project is being funded by the European Regional Development Fund, BT, BDUK, and the four local authorities.

Fibre broadband is the new generation of broadband - much faster, more reliable and it uses a different technology. Whilst traditional broadband (known as ADSL) is delivered via copper telephone lines, fibre broadband commonly uses fibre optic cable to link between the customer and the telephone exchange.

Fibre broadband can be delivered in two ways - fibre to the cabinet (FTTC) and fibre to the premises (FTTP).

FTTC uses fibre-optic cables throughout the network right up to the street cabinet. It then uses copper wires to connect the cabinet to homes and businesses. FTTC provides wholesale download speeds up to 80Mbps and upload speeds up to 20Mbps. FTTP means fibre-optic cables run right to the door of each house or business. It provides wholesale download speeds up to 330Mbps and upload speeds up to 30Mbps.

Check the Connecting Cheshire website to see if your business can be upgraded and then contact your Internet Service Provider or shop around for the best deal and order a fibre broadband service - it doesn't happen automatically and you could make a saving compared with your current broadband contract.

Those who either live or work in Halton have amenities, attractions and activities in abundance. From shopping parks to Green flag award winning parks, rugby to rambling, medieval ruins to a state of the art theatre, there are certainly many diverse opportunities to be explored throughout the area.

There is no need to go out of the borough to find ideas to fill valuable leisure time. In Widnes, The Hive is a big success with a brownfield site transformed into a high quality leisure park with a 5-screen cinema, bowling alley, ice rink and restaurants. At Select Security Stadium, rugby fans can enjoy watching Widnes Vikings, a club with a long and proud heritage in rugby league. Over in Runcorn, there is a cinema, the award winning Brindley theatre and even a Snowsports Centre.

The two latest additions to Halton's growing leisure offer are E-scape & Velocity. The UK's first designated electric off road riding centre, E-scape, is located at Preston Brook, to the east of Runcorn. Recently opened in Widnes, Velocity is one of the largest indoor trampoline parks in the UK and offers an exhilarating fun experience.

The picturesque villages of Hale and Daresbury hold their own surprises;





one of the thatched cottages in Hale was once home to England's tallest man, 9 3" John Middleton and Daresbury's most famous resident was the famous children's author, Lewis Carroll. Both areas also offer scenic walks; ambling along the Mersey coastline at Hale or wandering through the lush Cheshire countryside surrounding Daresbury.

Nature lovers are catered for with plenty of bird watching locations, nature reserves and sites of special scientific interest (SSIS) on both sides of the bridge. Culture vultures can wander in the footsteps of ancient abbots amongst the medieval ruins at Norton Priory Museum and Gardens and also experience the intricacies of science at Catalyst Science Discovery Centre.

The area offers endless opportunities to enjoy the outdoors, with three canals and miles of footpaths right on the doorstep. Halton Castle, one of only two surviving Norman castles in Cheshire, has the best vantage point in the borough and has impressive views along the Mersey Estuary including the mountains of North Wales. It is an excellent spot to see the ongoing Mersey Gateway works and there is even a pub, built where the old 18th century Court House stood. Shopping options are plentiful. There are big brand names at Runcorn Shopping Centre and Widnes Shopping Park and innumerable independent traders throughout both town centres. Runcorn has a weekly outdoor market and Widnes Market is renowned for its friendly atmosphere and variety of stalls, both indoor and out.

Eating out is easy, with plenty of options for all ages, budgets and tastes. National chains such as Frankie & Benny's, Nando's and Brewers Fayre can be found at The Hive, with lots of smaller, independent cafes and restaurants dotted throughout Widnes & Runcorn town centres. The Brindley café, for example, overlooks the Bridgewater Canal and is a great place to relax, enjoy a homemade cake and watch the boats pass by. Many of the pubs are renowned locally for their food and regularly hold special themed nights offering different cuisines.

For those who do want to venture further afield, the stunning scenery of North Wales and the Lake District is within one hour's drive. Chester, Liverpool, Warrington and Manchester can all be reached in half an hour and offer their own sporting, shopping and cultural opportunities.
